Important achievements

- (i) On 22nd January 2018, Project Agreement of World Bank assisted “Uttarakhand Drinking Water & Sanitation Project for Peri-urban areas” has been signed among GoI, GoUK & WB officials for Under this project, 35 identified peri-urban areas will be covered under 75 LPCD water supply. During first year of project, 02 schemes will be taken up.
- (ii) On 3rd January 2018, Hon’ble Chief Minister of the state inaugurated Bio-Crush Reverse Vending Machine with SMS. This machine is established under SBM(G)’s CSR fund of Allahabad Bank, Saharanpur Road, Dehradun and Swajal Project at Secretariate, Uttarakhand. This machine has capacity to crush 500 Pet plastic bottles in one hour and produced flakes can be recycled to make fabric. It will not only keep Secretariate premises clean but also promote cleanliness among the daily visitors/officers/workers of the Secretariate. Machine has a digital screen on which Governments initiatives, programmes can be run by using a simple pendrive.
- (iii) During 15th September to 02nd October 2017, the state implemented “Swachhta Hi Sewa” campaign. in all rural areas. During this campaign various IEC activities like Nukkad Natak, Swachhta Rath, rallies in selected rural schools/Madarsas, hand washing, 10 lakh bulk SMS, advertisements in News papers, voluntary works, ‘Toilet- Ek Prem Katha’, cleaning of Ganga Ghats, Ganga Art Marathon etc. were organized.
- (iv) 2nd October 2017 was celebrated as “Swachh Bharat Diwas” and on this occasion winners of Ganga Art Marathon and winners of essay completion & Short movie competitions organized during ‘Swachh Sankalp se Swachh Siddhi’ were distribute. Prizes and Certificates were distributed by Hon’ble Governor and Hon’ble Chief Minister of the state in the gracious presence of Hon’ble MP Tehri & Hon’ble Minister, Higher Education, GoUK.
- (v) For sustainability of ‘ODF’ status in the state, two days workshop was organized at ‘Swajal Pathshala’. Trainings are being imparted to ASHA and Anganwadi workers of of the state. Since August 2017, 19 such trainings have been conducted in which 718 ASHA & Anganwadi workers have been trained.
- (vi) During 27-28 July 2017, a two day Orientation Workshop was organized at ‘Swajal Pathshala’ in which 05 Zila Swachh Bharat Preraks (ZSBPs), Aanganwadi /ASHA workers, PRI representatives and district Peyjal and Swachhta Samanvayaks participated. The objective of the workshop was how to sustain the status of cleanliness in the state.
- (vii) On 22nd June 2017, the Uttarakhand state was declared “Open Defecation Free” by Hon’ble Chief Minister in the presence of Hon’ble Union Cabinet Minister, Rural Development and Sanitation, Secretery (DWS), GoI. On this occasion Hon’ble MLA of state, representatives of PRIs, Gram Pradhans, DPROs,



BDOs, District Magistrates, departmental officials and NGOs that have done extraordinary work in the field of sanitation in rural areas were presented mementos and certificates. Overall 374 mementos and certificates were distributed.

- (viii) On 25th May 2017, 'Jal Diwas' program was organized in district Pauri. The program was inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister Shri Yashpal Arya. Representatives of various educational institutions and Govt. Departments were present. On this occasion winners of the drawing competition held during December 2016, were given prize cheques of Rs. 20000, Rs. 15000, Rs. 10000 for First prize, Second prize and Third prize respectively along with consolation prize of Rs. 5000. Along with prize cheques, mementos and certificates were also distributed.

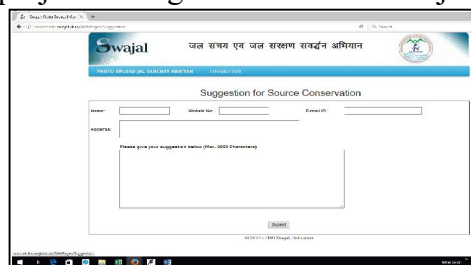

- (ix) People are being motivated through various IEC activities like Pamphlets, Jal Chetana Rath, Nukkad Nataks, News papers etc.
- (x) For water source rejuvenation and conservation, a webportal link <http://sourceinfo.swajaluk.in> has been developed by Swajal Project. At this link information related to source measurement, discharge & Geo tagging of water sources will be done at district level. For this, all district project management units of Swajal, UJS/UJN have been trained at Swajal Pathshala.
